Tri-State EMC Operation Round Up Awards Scholarships to Deserving Students

Il of the money collected through Operation Round Up goes to nonprofits, charities and school systems locally in the Tri-State EMC service area. The money comes from Tri-State EMC members who round up their bills to the next whole dollar. Once a month, the Tri-State EMC Foundation board considers grant requests and distributes the money.

In 2013, the Operation Round Up board made the decision to grant a vocational student from Fannin County High School, Copper Basin High School, Hiwassee Dam High School and Mountain Education Charter School each a \$500 scholarship. The Operation Round Up board elected to allow each school's scholarship committee to decide

5 STEPS FOR SAFE DIGGING

Working on an outdoor project? Always call 8-1-1 first, because you never know what's below.

Here are five easy steps for safe digging:

1. NOTIFY

Call 8-1-1 or make a request online two to three days before you start.



Know what's **below**. **Call** before you dig.

2. WAIT

Wait two to three days for a response to your request. Affected utilities will send a locator to mark any underground utility lines.



3. CONFIRM

Confirm that all affected utilities have responded by comparing the markers to the list of utilities the 8-1-1 call center notified.



4. RESPECT

Respect the markers provided by the affected utilities. They are your guide for the duration of your project.



5. DIG CAREFULLY

If you can't avoid digging near the markers (within 18-24 inches on all sides, depending on state laws), consider moving your project.
